DEACON

ANNUAL REPORT (February 2, 2020)

In 2019 I started my 18th year as deacon at St. Edmund Church. That is almost 2/3 of my 29 years in ordained ministry; during that time I have served with five vicars/priests-in-charge by assignment from two bishops. It has been rewarding involvement with the congregation in offering the ministry and mission of Christ in our community. Many strong relationships have developed. During this past year my ministry as deacon has, as usual, had many dimensions.

The primary ministry of every deacon is "a special ministry of servanthood directly under your bishop. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely." (BCP, p. 543) At St. Edmund Church I coordinate our benevolence and outreach ministry efforts. In 2019 we have been able to respond in an adequate manner to need. Following initial assessment of the situation, aid has been given for needs such as rent, utilities, and medical care for individuals and families. This type of benevolence is under the authority of the priest (according Episcopal Church canons). Over past years this responsibility has been delegated to me by the various priests. In addition to encouraging congregational members to become personally involved in local efforts and organizations, St. Edmund Church also assists community efforts and organizations with financial contribution. During 2019, we provided funds to DeSoto Cares Homeless Services, DeSoto County High School JROTC, Guardian Ad Item Program, and the community movie program at Tree of Knowledge Park. I serve in a consulting role with DeSoto Cares Homeless Services for program and community issues.

Another aspect of the ministry of a deacon is "to assist the bishop and priests in public worship and in the ministration of God's Word and Sacraments, and you are to carry out other duties assigned to you from time to time." (BCP, p. 543) In this capacity, I serve liturgically and preach at the Sunday Eucharists and coordinate the other liturgical ministers (acolytes, Eucharistic Ministers, lectors, and greeters). I also provide home (hospital & nursing home) Communion for shut-in and sick members of the congregation as well as coordinate the Eucharistic Visitors (who also provide home Communion). This past December, I conducted an Advent program of Evening Prayer with Mediation and supper.

At the diocesan level, I served in 2019 as facilitator of the Clinical Pastoral Training for two individuals seeking diaconal ordination. I also serve on the diocesan Commission on Ministry, including being the liaison for one person considering ordination in her discernment process with her home parish.

Although not an actual diaconal ministry, I serve as monthly newsletter editor and administrator of the St. Edmund website and Facebook page.

This coming December I will complete 30 years as a deacon and in January 2021 I will reach mandatory retirement age for clergy (as established by Episcopal Church canons). At that time, in conjunction with the bishop, options exist that include actual retirement from assigned ministry or receive year-by-year assignment. It is my intent to request the bishop grant me a three month sabbatical this summer as part of the discernment process in deciding the best path forward in 2021. I'm sure the congregation will keep us in your prayer as Nancy Jo and I consider this milestone in our life together. --Deacon Robert Vaughn


